The clinic is targeted to racing sailors. Prior match racing experience is not required. The clinic will be non-spinnaker and will use J/22s provided by CMA.

Participants: 12 minimum (20 Maximum) - Preference will be given to women.

The Lead Instructor at the Richmond clinic will be course creator and Women's National and World Champion Liz Baylis.
