The Match Racing Clinic Curriculum was created by Dave Perry and Liz Baylis with assistance from North U. The course combines shoreside sessions with on the water drills and races.

The clinic is targeted to racing sailors. Prior match racing experience is not required. This clinic will use Catalina 22s. The clinic will be non-spinnaker. Enrollment is limited.

The Registration Fee is \$300. The fee includes the full course, course materials, use of the boats, snacks and lunches each day.


